We told the Mayor and Councilmembers about the sudden, drastic staff reductions implemented by St. Joseph Medical Center management. We told them about the delays in attending to basic patient needs, such as toileting, medications and water.

We asked them to urge hospital management to meet with us!

Katie Laughlin as she addressed the Mayor and Councilmembers. She spoke of a confused elderly patient who fell and hurt his head while at the hospital. She explained that this likely would never have happened before these drastic cuts to CNAs. "What's to prevent this patient from falling again?" she asked.

As RNs on the front lines of patient care, we know that management is living in an **ALTERNATIVE REALITY** if they think that this won't affect patient safety and patient satisfaction. It already has.

We have asked H.R. to meet with us. These unilateral changes to our working conditions that affect patient safety **must** be negotiated.
