Dignity has refused to cash out unused vacation hours for many Registered Nurses at St. John's Regional Medical Center in Oxnard and St. John's Pleasant Valley Hospital in Camarillo.

Our 121RN collective bargaining agreement states that an RN with more than 200 banked hours may cash out 40 of those hours each December and 40 hours each April, for a maximum of 80 hours per calendar year.

Well, this year Dignity management has decided not to allow RNs to cash out any of their banked hours for various reasons.

Whatever their stated reasons, Dignity has violated our contract, labor law, and common sense.

Dignity management has demonstrated complete unwillingness to extend their very own concepts of "Humankindness," "Healing Hospital," or "Sacred Work" to its employees during what should be one of the Catholic company's most sacred holidays.
